

AFFILIATION INSTRUCTIONS



STEP ONE

In order to use HOSA's Affiliation System, you must have your chapter's charter number and password. If you are a new chapter or you do not know your chapter's charter number or password, contact your state advisor or HOSA Headquarters.

STEP TWO

Go to the HOSA website at www.hosa.org and click on **Login** at the top right of the home page. Login as a Local Advisor using your charter number and password.

STEP THREE

From the main menu, be sure to review the affiliation instructions especially if you are unfamiliar with the online affiliation system. Click **Complete the Affiliation Application** to begin the chapter affiliation process. Ensure all chapter information is correct including the billing and demographic information. For returning HOSA members, you can re-affiliate these members without re-entering their information. For all new members, please enter the member's name, demographic, and contact information.

Over 11,525 health science students, advisors, health industry leaders, judges, and guests gathered at Disney's Coronado Springs Resort to compete, learn, network, and celebrate HOSA's 42nd Annual International Leadership Conference in Orlando, Florida, June 19-22, 2019 with HOSA members from across the United States, Canada, American Samoa and China!

Led by Sarah Fleischman, the 2018-2019 HOSA President, delegates took advantage of four exciting general sessions, 110 educational symposiums, over 75 exhibits from companies, universities, and nonprofit organizations, and two exhilarating speakers!

Dr. Steve Robbins addressed diversity and inclusion in his keynote at the opening session of HOSA's 42nd International Leadership Conference! And, the 20th U.S. Surgeon General, Dr. Jerome Adams provided remarks for HOSA's International Leadership Conference Recognition Session.

HOSA-Future Health Professionals inducted four new members into HOSA's Hall of Fame for extraordinary contributions and service and for serving as a pillar of strength to the organization by helping to develop future leaders of the health industry. The 2019 Hall of Fame inductees include:

HOW THE PATCH EXCHANGE WORKS?

Until December 31, 2019, patches can be exchanged with HOSA Headquarters for \$1 per patch if they are mailed to HOSA-Future Health Professionals, 548 Silicon Drive, Suite 101, Southlake, TX 76092. You may purchase patches directly from Awards Unlimited, however, the cost is \$3.80 per patch.







Any properly accredited, licensed school or college offering career or technical programs is eligible for a charter issued by NTHS. **There is no charter fee.** Visit www.nths.org for additional information on steps to start a Chapter. We have enclosed a membership form with the HOSA Logo so that the HOSA Scholarship fund will get the credit for the membership; **however, it is preferable you charter** online. On the application under "Referral", choose "Other" and type in "HOSA mailing".

Once your school has an NTHS Chapter, then submitting members is easy. The one-time fee is \$30 and students receive the following benefits:

- NTHS display portfolio, member certificate, online access to a general letter of recommendation for the student's portfolio, lapel pin, membership card, window decal, white graduation tassel and official NTHS diploma seal
- Scholarship Opportunities
- Online access to order three custom letters of recommendation for potential employers, school admissions, and scholarship committees.

- Opportunities to purchase official NTHS commencement accessories and logo gear.
- NTHS professional development opportunities.

Students are considered active members as long as they are enrolled in classes offered by their charter institution. Student candidates must meet national and local membership standards.

Will Your Pharmacy Technician Students Be Eligible?

Attest that your curriculum includes PTCB-required knowledge and ensure your students are eligible to earn their nationally recognized pharmacy technician certification.

Being certified as a pharmacy technician (CPhT) is required in many pharmacy settings. PTCB is the country's leading certification program for pharmacy technicians and we are making important changes that affect your students.

Beginning in 2020, PTCB will require individuals to complete a PTCB-recognized education/training program or equivalent work experience to be eligible to apply for the PTCB Certified Pharmacy Technician (CPhT) credential.


